The merger of the Society with Japan 21 in October 2007 marked a new and exciting phase in the development of our mission: the addition of Japan 21's well-established programme of educational and grassroots activity relating to Japan complements our existing business-related, academic and cultural activities and enables us to provide opportunities for young people and adults alike to participate in projects and events across the UK.

membership

The Japan Society has a membership of over 1,000 members both individual and corporate, of whom some 45% are Japanese. Its varied programme provides opportunities for members and others interested in Japan to meet and exchange ideas and experience.

With the incorporation of Japan 21 programmes, the Japan Society has enhanced its outreach activities. Its work with schools throughout the UK and small grants scheme to support local projects both serve to encourage and deepen understanding of Japan.
