Learning Objectives:

• To learn about the traditions and customs associated with Obon, one of the most important annual festivals in Japan.

Learning Outcomes:

- Students will be able to explain the main events/activities of Obon in sequential order.
- Students will make a paper lantern representing the Chochin lamps used at the festival.

Curriculum Links:

- MFL: Broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words (KS2).
- Art and Design: Use a range of materials creatively to design and make products (KS1), develop an increasing awareness of different kinds of art, craft and design (KS2).

Task 1: What is 'Obon'?

- 1. Discuss any summer celebrations or festivals in the culture/country/community of the children. What kind of festivals are there? Do people wear traditional dress? What food is eaten at festivals?
- 2. Explain what Obon is and how it is celebrated in Japan using the **Obon Presentation**.
- 3. Watch the **Obon video** to recap and allow students to see the festival in action.
- 4. Return to the Obon presentation to complete the short true or false quiz. Students can be split into pairs or small groups to confer.

Estimated Time: 15 - 20 minutes

Task 2: Identify parts of the festival

- Students should now be familiar with some of the activities that take place during the Obon. Asking pupils to arrange the **Obon Sequence Cards** in the order that they might happen in Obon celebrations. Put students into pairs or small table groups and hand out the cards. You may wish to pre-cut the cards to save time.
- Call on students for their answers.

Estimated Time: 10 minutes

Task 3: Make Chochin

- Can students remember why lanterns are used at Obon? Remind them of their significance.
- Using the chochin paper lantern video for guidance, make paper lanterns decorations together and hang them up for display.

Estimated Time: 10 -15 minutes

Extension Activities

1. Students can follow the video to make an origami uchiwa (paper fan). These are often used in the summer heat in Japan and many people will take one to festivals with them.
