The Emperor and Imperial Family

In the UK we have a king and a queen, in Japan they have an emperor and an empress. The current Emperor Naruhito took the throne on 1 May 2019 and is the 126th monarch of Japan. The reign of each emperor gets a special name. This one is called "Reiwa" (令和) which means "beautiful harmony".

The chrysanthemum is an important symbol of the Japanese Emperor and his family – the throne of the Emperor and the imperial seal (similar to coat of arms) both have a chrysanthemum design. That's also why The Japan Society uses a chrysanthemum flower as its logo!

In the past, the emperor and empress of Japan would wear elaborate outfits which you can see in old artworks or on the emperor and empress dolls in a traditional hina doll set.

Below you can see the layers of different coloured kimono with elaborate designs and the traditional headwear and hairpieces. It looks just like the Japanese imperial court outfits worn hundreds of years ago.




Design a UK-Japan Costume for the Emperor and Empress Hina Dolls


