### **Learning Objective:**

 To learn about the foods, decorations and customs associated with Hina-matsuri; a festival for girls in Japan.

### Task 1

- 1. Ask students if they know what International Women's Day is and if so when it is? Explain that in March in Japan there is a much older, traditional festival that celebrates girls called Hinamatsuri.
- 2. Explain Hina-matsuri celebrations in Japan using the **Hina-matsuri Presentation**.

**Estimated Time:** 10 minutes

Task 2

1. Tell students they are going to do a team guiz about the doll's festival on slide 8 of the

PowerPoint presentation.

2. Divide the class into two teams or small groups and award 1/2/4 points to the team

depending on the question.

Answers: a) Doll, b) 3rd March, c) for the health and happiness of girls, d) It's bad luck to leave them

out, e) White, pink, green and yellow

**Estimated Time:** 10 minutes

Task 3

1. Tell students they are going to make paper origami dolls (alternatively, students can colour in or

decorate the **Hina-matsuri Colouring Page**)

2. Use the printed **Origami Instructions** to make the dolls – one for the emperor and one for the

empress. Students can follow along by watching the teacher on a visualiser or follow the

instructions (there are two versions – easy or difficult for older students).

**Estimated Time:** 20 minutes

**Extension Activities** 

1. Show the video tutorial of how to make an origami doll bookmark.

2. Use the **Hina Kanji Worksheet** to teach students about Japanese dates and practice writing

the kanji for month and day.

3. Use the **Japanese Woman Profile Worksheet**; students can learn about inspirational Japanese

women and do their own research to write a profile.
