Technical Director of the Maltese Kendo Federation from its inauguration in 2010 and President up to 2020.

As a recognised authority on British, European and International kendo history and a high-level international kendo instructor – Kyôshi 7-dan, I believe very strongly in maintaining the traditional interpretation of kendo and I'm dedicated to the classical practice of *koryu* (Historic schools) and the philosophy that kendo personifies. Having visited Japan on numerous occasions over many years for study and practice in a continuing quest for knowledge and improvement.
