All Year Japan in Your Classroom School Visits: In 2022, JIYC school visits resumed activities after the pandemic.

**Loan Resources:** continue to offer a variety of materials and cultural artefacts representing traditional and modern aspects of Japan on loan to primary and secondary schools, as well as other educational organisations throughout the year to support their Japan-related topics and cultural events.

**New Resource Development:** the education team worked with professionals and teachers to develop new Japan-related video and digital teaching resources for educators.

January - April

\* Hosted a two-part Online Japanese Language Taster class for young people aged 11-18.

\* Offered Sixth Form Japan Tasters as a special programme for sixth form students who missed out on our regular Japan Day in 2021 due to pandemic restrictions. Students took part in soroban, kokeshi and hanko workshops and listened to guest speaker Aileen Conant, a Japanese-American theatre director.

\* Hosted a Kamishibai Workshop at a secondary School in Hackney. Students experienced Aya Nakamura's version of *The Spider's Thread* and created stories with author Julian Sedgwick.

\* Participated in Express Yourself 2022, a Festival of Languages and Culture.

\* Collaborated with Haiku Poet Paul Conneally to provide two free family haiku workshops for children up to the age of 14 and their caregivers in Calthorpe Community Gardens during the Easter school holidays.

\* Release of Swim Swim Koinobori, a new kamishibai story set for loan and digital use.

May - August

\* Attended Reading University with Tomoko Hoult to deliver soroban workshops to trainee primary school teachers.

\* Sixth Form Japan Day was held for the first since 2019, in collaboration with Ritsumeikan University at Birkbeck University of London. Guest speakers for the event included Ryan Keeble, News Producer at Fujisankei Communications as well as student panellists from SOAS, UEA, and University of Cambridge. Attendees took part in a range of cultural workshops, including new offerings: shogi and origami.

### Small Grants

In 2022, the Japan Society Small Grants Scheme awarded **23 grants totalling £10,310**. Applications came from all over the country, including Liverpool, Fife and Stratford-upon-Avon.

At the historic **De La Warr Pavilion in Bexhill** on the South Coast of England, a small grant supported **workshops for children**, families and young people accompanying an exhibition by artist, Minoru Nomata. Meanwhile, in Camden, London, funding from the Society went towards a kimono themed exhibition and talks, showcasing kimono and its place in fashion both traditional and contemporary.

High School students in Birmingham explored Japanese art in a multi-media visual arts project; In Broadstairs, a day of Japanese Culture took place in celebration of the 10th anniversary of Japanese at the school; and young students taking part in 'Japanese Club' in Aylesbury learnt to write Japanese characters through the art of Japanese calligraphy.

The Greater Good Project in Rossendale planned a series of Japan-themed workshops to help introduce the local community to Japanese culture and the arts, while a special matsuri took place at Tatton Park in Liverpool, inviting members of the public to experience different aspects of Japanese culture first hand, including calligraphy, martial arts and music.
