# Earthquake Events

Following the Great East Japan Earthquake on 11 March, the Society established the Tohoku Earthquake Relief Fund to deliver medium and long-term support for the recovery. While the Society organized few fundraising events itself, it provided advice and support to others. As of 31 October 2011, some £640,000 had been raised and was being distributed in partnership with the Sanaburi Foundation, Sendai, to local NPOs and voluntary organizations.

Through the 'Messages to Japan' project, some 6,000 letters and cards from pupils at over 100 British schools were sent to schools in Iwate, Miyagi and Fukushima prefectures.
