

## Storytelling with Japanese Kamishibai

### Lesson 7: Manga & Kamishibai

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#### Learning Objectives

- Understanding the techniques and features of Japanese manga
- Demonstrate understanding of manga by developing own drawing techniques, using Japanese manga as a model.
- Experiment with a range of illustration skills (line drawing, drawing characters, and expressing emotions in characters).

#### Learning Outcomes

- Examples of manga characters/drawings in the manga style.

#### English National Curriculum Links

##### Year 2:

Pupils should be taught:

- To use drawing to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination
- To develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space.

## Task 1 Draw in Japanese Manga-style

1. Explaining that one of the sources from which Manga-style illustrations evolved was kamishibai illustration (along with other traditional styles of Japanese artwork).

2. Look at **Manga Style Worksheet** together to look at the illustrations and discuss features of Manga (focusing on characters). In Manga-style illustrations eyes are normally large, with noses and mouths being small. Hair is often stylised. Make note of these features by sketching and writing key words. (It may be useful to focus on simpler styles of Manga characters in order to give all students greater confidence in illustrating the scenes of the story.)

**Estimated Time: 10 minutes**

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## Task 2: How to draw Manga characters

1. Watch video series **How to Draw Manga Characters with Mio**.
2. Discuss with the students the style of illustration demonstrated.

**Estimated Time: 5 Minutes**

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## Task 3: Create your Manga character

1. Using the **Manga Illustration Examples**, children practice drawing Manga characters which they will eventually include on their Kamishibai.

**Estimated Time: 30 minutes**

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## Feedback

- Students present their characters to the class, verbalising what techniques they have used to ensure that their drawing is in the style of manga.

**Estimated Time: 30 minutes**

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## Extension Activities

1. You may wish for children to experiment by drawing their own Manga style characters and fill in information about their character using page 2 of the worksheet.
