#### **Schools Education**

Japan in Your Classroom School Visits: In 2020, our volunteers visited 12 schools in the winter term before the lockdown in March and school visits being temporarily suspended.

School Links: establishing new partnerships whilst providing targeted support to help strengthen existing links

through bilateral exchange trips, conferences, and curriculum-support projects.

Loan Resources: a variety of materials and authentic cultural artefacts representing both traditional and modern aspects of Japan on loan to primary and secondary schools throughout the year to support teachers with their Japan-related topics.

Coventry Young Ambassadors: The education team continues to support the 'Cities of Peace Noh Theatre Project' with the Coventry Young Ambassadors Programme.

**New Resource Development:** the education team has collaborated with a number of teachers and specialists to develop a range of new Japan-related teaching resources which were released throughout the 2020-2021

January

April Launched the Online Resources section in the education part of our website with new digital resources accompanied by schemes of work, presentations, and worksheets covering various topics designed for teachers.

May Resource highlights: Children's Day resources for parents and teachers and new Radio Taiso scheme of work, lesson plans and movement cards.

June Launched the Tanzaku Wish Gallery inviting the public to send us a picture of their tanzaku wishes with us for the Tanabata Festival in July.

July Resource highlights: Tanabata resources, including a new original kamishibai, craft video and home activity pack and launch of Sports Day and Sports Day at Home resources.

Resource highlights: Radio Taiso interview video with Risa Ono from the Japan Radio-Taiso Federation, new Obon August **resources** and **launch of soroban resources** with scheme of work and content designed for teachers.

September Resource highlights: Launch of digital kamishibai stories and Haiku resources with scheme of work and other content designed for teachers.

### **Small Grants**

In 2020, the Japan Society Grants scheme gave £11,656 of funding in support of 15 projects taking place all over the UK. What has been a highly unusual year has unfortunately led to many projects being put on hold, however in March students at King Edward VI Community College in Devon were able to hold a successful exhibition on Contemporary Japanese Art and Culture, while at the Kaetsu Educational & Cultural Centre the 18th Japan Day in Cambridge took place with cultural activities and performances.

The Small Grants Scheme focuses its support on education and community projects, and this year was no exception. In Torfaen in Wales, Mamiko Markham began introducing students at local primary and secondary schools to Japanese silk painting, and we look forward to seeing the painted fabric being turned into a special handmade kimono as a result. Work began on building a Japanese Peace Garden in Coventry, the final part of a long-term project involving primary schools in the city as they learnt about the important links between Coventry and Hiroshima.

While some projects are on hold, other organisers were able to adapt their plans to create online content and virtual events. Theatre maker and puppeteer, Aya Nakamura, held online workshops and talks based around her recently filmed paper theatre piece The Spider's Thread: Bristol Museum and Gallery are hard at work creating online content and educational resources to enhance learning about their collection of Netsuke; and Edinburgh City Art Centre's series of workshops and lectures planned to coincide with the exhibition E. A. Hornel: From Camera to Canvas will be moved online, enabling audiences from far and wide to join.

In the last decade, we are proud to have supported 342 projects with £217,959 of funding and as we all learn to adapt to the everchanging world around us, we look forward to receiving applications from organisers of new and exciting projects in the near future.
